ASUWB is in desperate need for a door between the ASUWB and CEB offices. We would like to switch out a solid panel in the false wall between the ASUWB and CEB offices (UW1 007/011) with a door panel (have a pass-through door between the two spaces) to ensure that we have multiple exit routes.	
<i>Question:</i> In 150 words or less, please describe the need for this program or service. Please include any data that might support your proposal (e.g., the number of students who have participated in your service or program in the past). If your program is currently funded by SAF, please indicate how you have used the money to help your organization meet its goals.	<p>Currently, the ASUWB office has only point of entry/exit (no windows and one door). In the case of an emergency, ASUWB members and others in our office (students, faculty, and staff) only have one way to get out and would be trapped if something was blocking the doorway. As the number of students increases each year, so does the number of students visiting the ASUWB office. This obviously poses a major issue because even though there is an increase of people in our space we still only have one exit.</p> <p>Recently, ASUWB has had three major scares concerning our safety. These incidents included statements from students</p>	

that ASUWB members would have no way out to get out if someone were to bring a gun or bomb into our office. ASUWB feels a great need to increase our office's security and feels that adding another exit is absolutely necessary to ensure our safety.

Question:

How do you plan to assess the program or service?

We plan to assess the ordering and installation of the door panel by continuing to be in close contact with Amy Van Dyke (Director of Physical Planning and Space Management) and George Theo (Director of Student and Residential Life) who researched the costs and logistics of the installation.

Question:

In 150 words or less, estimate how many currently enrolled students will likely benefit from your proposed service or program. Please estimate the number of other individuals (and indicate their affiliation) that might benefit from this service or program. Finally, please indicate other sources of financial support.

At least 227 students would benefit from the installation of a door between the ASUWB and CEB offices: 5 ASUWB members, 5 CEB members, 180 student organization officers (not including the other members of those organizations), 6 student assistants, 1 graduate student assistant, 29 ASUWB volunteers, 1 CEB volunteer, plus other students who come into both the ASUWB and CEB offices.

At least 9 other individuals would benefit from the installation of a door: 5 Student Life staff members, the Chancellor and 4 Vice Chancellors whom ASUWB meets with regularly, plus numerous faculty and staff both ASUWB and CEB collaborate with.

Student Life and student activity budgets are responsible for costs related to items in their areas, meaning ASUWB can only get financial assistance from Student Life and student activity budgets (i.e. SAF). This means ASUWB cannot get financial assistance from the Office of Physical Planning and Space Management, leaving SAF as our only funding option.

The benefits the students listed above will receive by installing a door between the ASUWB and CEB offices is increased safety in their place of work—Students will have

	another way to exit the office in the event of an emergency.
