The bikes will be available on a first come first serve basis, unless the demand for them becomes so great a reservation system is needed.

Improve residents knowledge of bike safety and bike laws.  
Improve options for fitness and outdoor recreation possibilities  
Giving students the life skill of using a bike

Below are some policy guidelines that would be put into place:

Free for UWB students

24 hour rental, if late one day, a warning, if late two days, a \$20 per day fee will apply

When a bike is checked out student will receive a

bike packet including:  
Optionally 1-2 bike bags  
Optionally 1 map of bothell and surrounding area  
1 helmet  
1 bike light  
1 Information packet detailing basic bike safety and usage.  
Brief (oral, 3-5 questions) pop-quiz on local bike laws. A score of 100% is required. The student will be permitted to review the laws as detailed in the information packet prior to the quiz. The student will be permitted to retake the quiz as many times is necessary, reviewing the information sheet in between. The student will only need to the test one time, not every time he/she rents the bike.  
The key to the bike lock  
A liability waiver must be signed once prior to checking out a bike to mitigate risk as well as ensure the student understands the risk associated with riding a bike (what to do if a flat tire occurs, how to ride safely in the city of Bothell, etc.).  
If the borrower of the bike loses or damages anything associated with the bike the student will be required to replace it or be fined the amount of damage. This will be noted in the aforementioned waiver.

Locks- 3 @ \$30 = \$90 + tax  
Bikes- 3 @ \$600 = \$1800 + tax  
Helmets - 3 @ \$40 = \$70 + tax

### **Other**

\$60 per quarter per bike maintenance (\$60x3= \$180
