These students work as peer leaders and organizers of research, action, and education projects centered on community-based learning and social justice action.</p>

If your program is currently funded by SAF, please indicate how you have used the money to help your organization meet its goals.</p>	<p data-bbox="584 730 1432 934">We are requesting \$3750 to provide a stipend for five Student Civic Fellows for the 2011-2012 year. They will receive \$250 per quarter for the academic calendar for completing a minimum of five hours per week of work.</p> <p data-bbox="584 934 1432 1144">We are also requesting \$800 for Student Civic Fellow development resources. To build their skills we need to provide training, host workshops, print materials and hold quarterly connection meetings for student leaders that the Student Civic Fellows will lead.</p> <p data-bbox="584 1144 1432 1522">Our three Student Civic Fellows are currently funded through the Services and Activities Fee from 2010-2011. This year we tailored the fellowship program to make a maximum impact on the campus and the student and so was not able to fill the ten expected slots from last year's fund. We instead have three highly active fellows that we provide stipends to on a quarterly basis from SAF.</p>

Many additional students and community members will benefit from the service projects and social awareness events coordinated by the students. For example, in the program's first year, all of the Student Civic Fellows helped out with last year's MLK Day of Service- a total of 68 UW Bothell students, staff/faculty, and family members participated in this event by serving the community. This year they helped create the projects, became site leaders and helped bring in</p>

The Student Fellows are currently planning two similar service projects for this coming spring quarter. The Student Civic Fellows also conduct in-class presentations that explain and promote the importance of community-based learning. The community-partner and poverty research that the Student Civic Fellows conduct influences the type, quality, and populations served by community-based learning, therefore benefiting the recipients of service. The estimated number of individuals and students that benefit from the work of the Student Civic Fellows is 500 from service days, publications on inequalities, class presentations and volunteer coordination.</p>
<p><b>How do you plan to assess the program or service?</b></p>	<p>We can assess whether the Student Civic Fellows have reached their target goals of supporting days of service by tracking the number of individuals involved and having an evaluation of the day(s). Each Student Fellow will be responsible for completing an exit interview with our office and the offices that their work impacted. As we require regular meetings with Student Civic Fellows we take time to check in with the fellows each week to ensure the fellowship is working for them and they are doing the work for their fellowship. By fall quarter 2011 we plan to have a pre and post community-based learning assessment measuring the effect that participating in the Student Civic Fellows Program may have on student development.</p>
<p><b>In 150 words or less, please describe the benefits that participants are likely to gain by attending or participating in this program or service.</b></p>	<p>The Student Civic Fellows have the opportunity to develop their leadership, academic/research, and professional skills. The Office of CBLR provides the students with leadership development trainings during our monthly meetings. They are also invited to professional development trainings such as the Bellevue Volunteer Manager's Summit and the Mentoring: Skills for Success Conference. The Student Civic Fellows gain a sense of civic responsibility, community, and satisfaction through the work and service they provide for the students, community, and office of Community-Based Learning and Research. They Student Civic Fellows also will qualify for more grants and scholarships related to volunteering and student leadership.</p>
